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#1089 Hairy Cow Fob

Finished Size: About 3.5" (9cm)

Assembly Method: Sewing or Glue

Materials: Not all cows are brown

Fabric: Pick a fabric that doesn't easily fray. Example of this are Felt, fleece, and faux leather. Foam is ok, if not sewing.

Fur: Tan about 4" x 9" (10x23cm) Head tuft - body color and lighter color

Face, Legs, and Tail: Contrast color to fur about 5" x 2"

Muzzle - lighter color or body color

Tongue - optional pink **Horns** - White or tan

Stuffing of Your Choice: Poly-fill fluff, crinkle, squeaker, stress ball, or tape measure.

Hanger Ribbon: Grosgrain ribbon, or twill tape are the most sturdy. - about 8-10"

Extras: Embroidery floss to add details like eyes and ear fluff.

Tools

- Scissors, or a Cutting Machine, like a Cricut
- For Cricut Maker
 - Rotary Blade
 - Fabric Mat
- For Cutting Machines with a Fine Point Blade
 - Standard or Light Grip Mat
 - Freezer Paper for Bonding
- Typical Sewing Materials (pins, scissors, matching thread, iron, etc.) or Hot Glue Gun



Hand Cutting Directions

Printing the Pattern:

Please make sure your printer is set to print at 100% or “actual size” and NOT “shrink to fit”. Please check the size of the boxes printed on every pattern piece to confirm accurate printing. These boxes should not just be close to the stated size, they must be EXACTLY the stated size. Please remember that plastic and cloth tape measures stretch over time. Try measuring with a ruler or the less-used end of your tape measure.

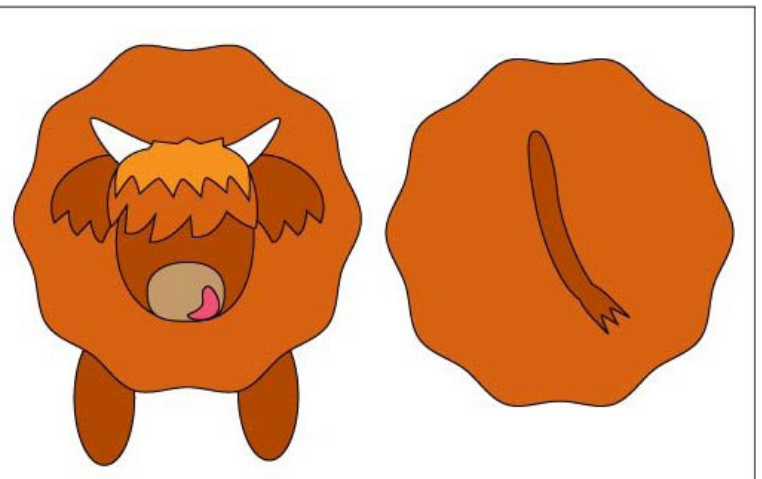
1. Print patterns at 100% size. Check scale square in verify accurate printing.
 - This pattern is not very fussy. If it is not exactly to scale don't worry.

Machine Cutting Directions

1. Cut front fabrics down to the approximate size needed
2. Cricut Maker: Apply fabric to cutting mats and continue to Cricut Design Space Instructions
3. Cutting Machines, such as Cricut Explore series, with a fine point blade: You must bond fabric and felt to another material. I suggest freezer paper. Faux leather and similarly stiff materials do not need to be bonded. You may want to test your materials.
4. Cut one 4”x 9” (10x23cm) or larger piece of freezer paper and bond it to the front of your fabric with a hot iron.
5. Place fabric on cutting mat paper side up.

Cricut Design Space Instructions

1. Download zip file
2. Un-zip
3. Open Cricut Design Space
4. New Project
5. Upload your selected project into design space
6. Add to Canvas
7. Follow directions on the SVG about checking the size, ungrouping, and changing the line to pen tool.
8. Re-color cow if desired
9. Make-It
10. Check placement of pieces on the mats and adjust if needed.
11. Press Continue



12. Select Base Material

- Cricut Maker: Choose Felt, Acrylic Fabric
- Cricut Explore Choose Felt, Craft Bonded - works well for many materials.

13. Cut Materials

14. Design Space may change the mat order. Please check which mat is next, or select the mat you want to cut.

15. Unload and change mats as needed. Also changing the material type as needed.

Assemble Sheep

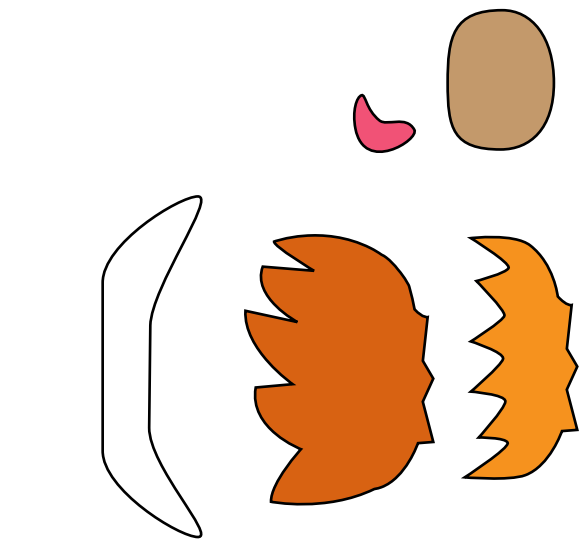
1. Attach Cow Face to front side of one body piece by sewing or with glue. It should be a little higher than center.
2. Add Horns
3. Head Tuft if desired and then add the optional second one.
4. Attach Muzzle and optional tongue.
5. Add desired face details. I like to sew french knots for the eyes or add beads.
6. Attach Tail to the center of the back/butt (if putting a tape measure inside skip this step)
7. Glue Ribbon into place at the top on the inside
8. Sew or glue 3/4 around the body.
9. Stuff with filling, crinkle, squeaker, or tape measure.
10. Sew nearly all of the rest. Leave an opening to add a touch more stuffing if needed, then close. (see next steps for tape measure)
11. For the tape measure tail, don't close completely Allow the pull tab to poke out of a hole for use. Squeeze the cow to retract the tail.
12. You may wish to make the pull tab longer or easier to grab by sewing on another piece of material or ribbon. The tail tuft is the perfect size to glue on the tab.

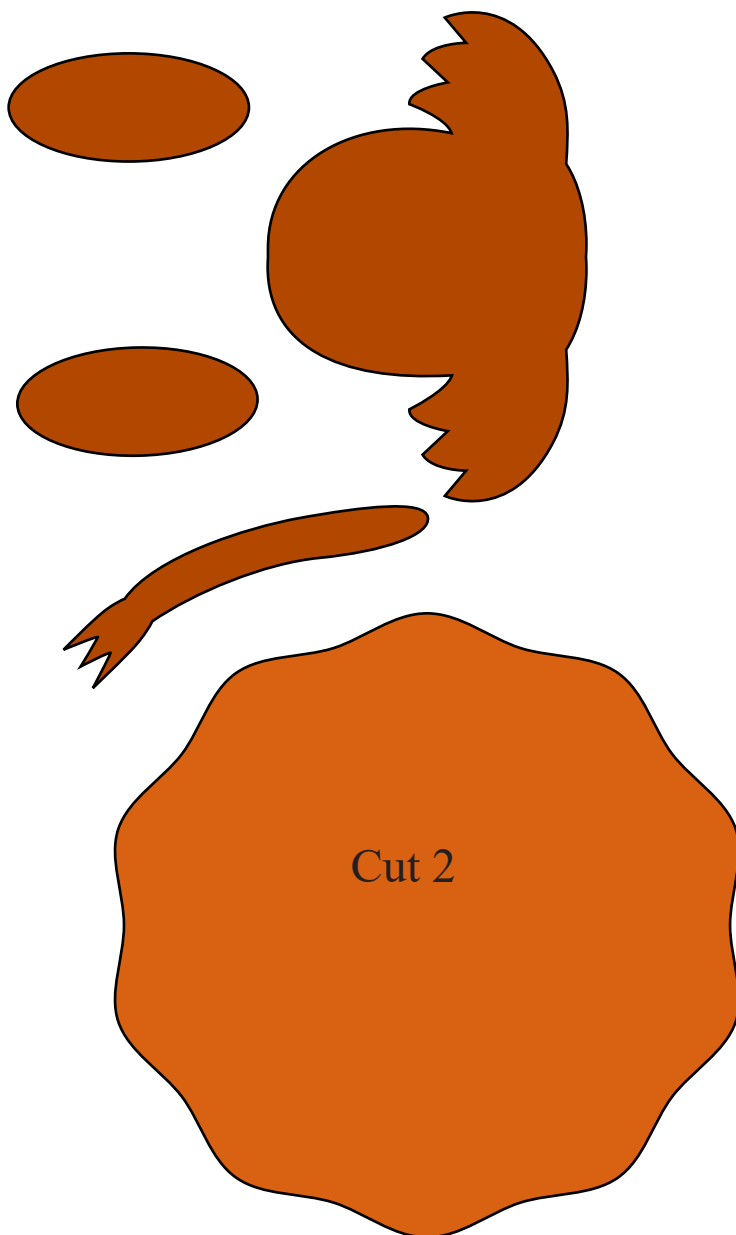
