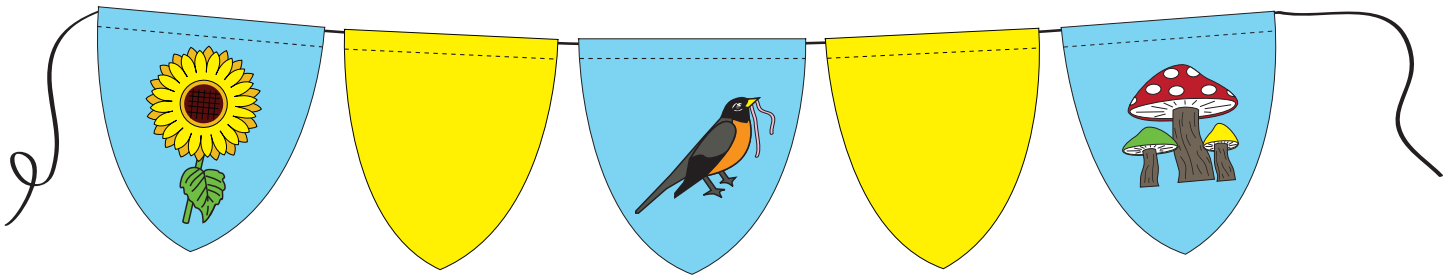




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#1069: Cricut Adventure: Sunflower Bunting Patterns & Instructions



This design is part of a set of three patterns

Sizes

- Sunflower: 4.3" wide x 6.7" tall (10.9 x 17cm)
- Dragon Scale Bunting: Cut: 8" wide x 9.8" tall (20.3 x 24.9cm)
 Finished: 8"wide x 8.8" tall (20.3 x 22.3cm)

Materials

Sunflower

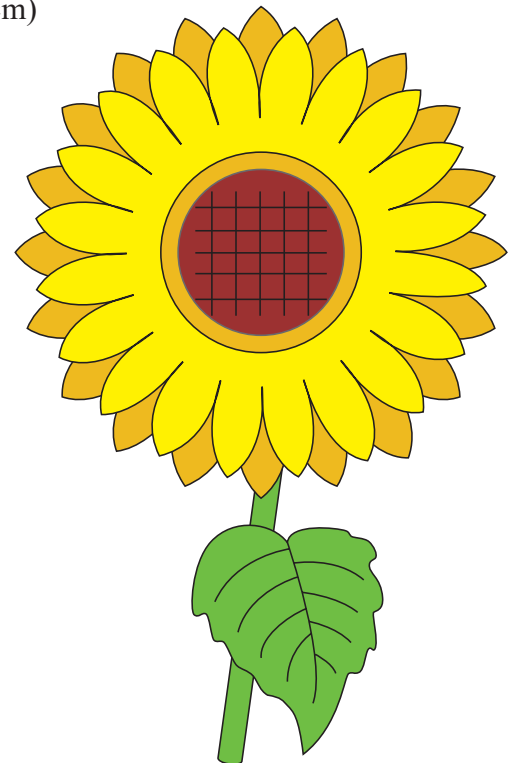
- Paper, Felt, or vinyl in the following colors.
- Petals - yellow and dark yellow
- Center - dark yellow and brown
- Stem & Leaves -green

Dragon Scale Bunting - For 5 Flags

- (Paper for Felt) - 8.5x11" or larger
- Yellow- 2 sheets or more
- Blue- 3 sheets or more
- String or Ribbon - about 1/2" wide

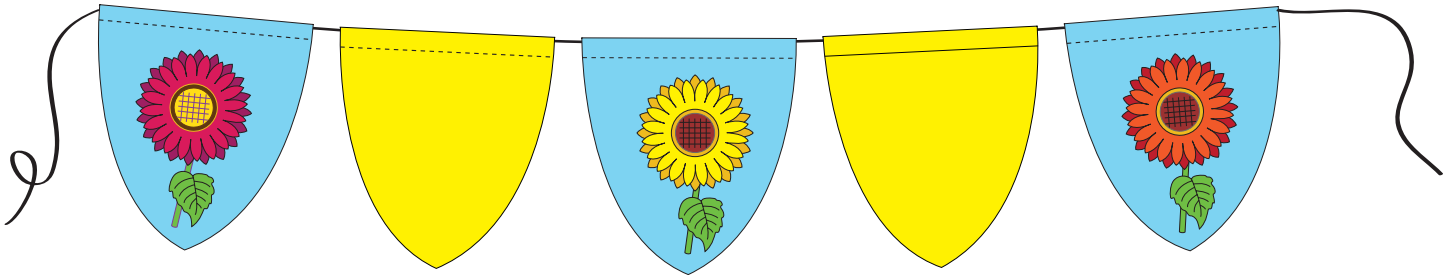
Both

- Cricut Pen - I used Black .4 size
- Glue that matches your materials
- Embroidery floss in coordinating colors for felt (optional)



Tools

- Circuit - Any model (Joy sunflower only)
- Fine Point Blade (paper and bonded felt) or Rotary Blade (bonded or unbonded felt)
- Scoring wheel or Scoring stylus (Bunting)
- Standard or Light Grip Mat (Paper or Felt with freezer paper) OR Fabric Mat for unbonded felt
- Freezer Paper (Felt)



Notes for Cricut Joy Users

The Joy can cut out all of the main design pieces, however the bunting is too large and would need to be cut by hand using the included PDF pattern.

Note for Felt

Test your desired pen on your fabric, as it may bleed or not work as expected. You can eliminate the drawn lines, if desired. Also consider using a water soluble fabric pen to mark out lines for embroidery.

Felt cuts easiest with the rotary blade that the Maker and Marker 3 have. You can cut bonded felt with a fine point blade, but the type of felt matters much more. Check out my video all about this “Cutting No Fray Materials with Your Cricut”. Search for it on Youtube or click the link.

Design Space Notes

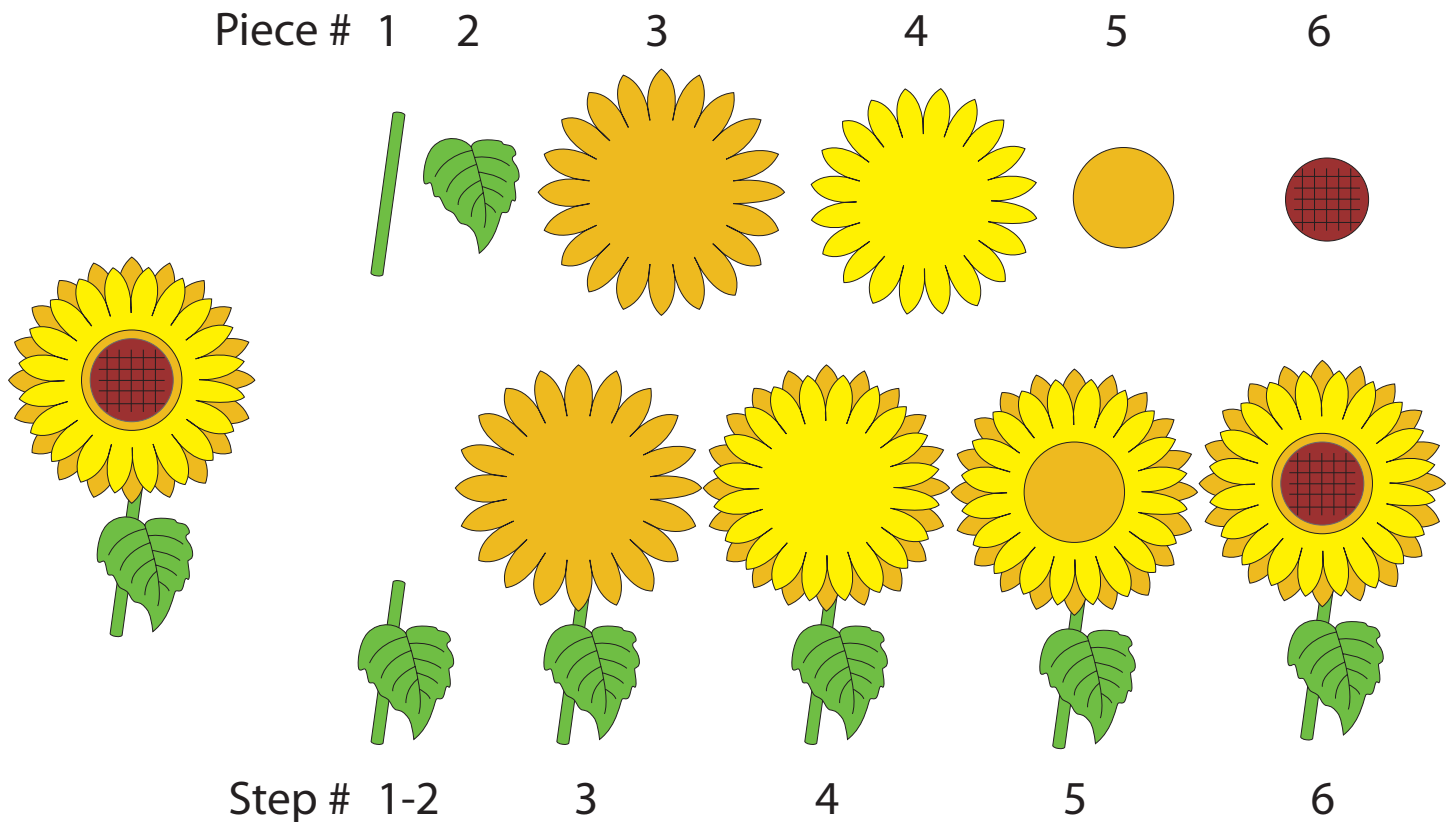
Purple objects will be used with the pen tool. Red objects will be used with the scoring tool.

Design Space Instructions

1. Download zip file
2. Un-zip
3. Open Cricut Design Space
4. New Project
5. Upload into Design Space
6. Add to Canvas
7. Follow directions on the SVG about checking the size, ungrouping, changing some lines to the pen tool or score lines, and attaching.
Felt Note: You may wish to eliminate the pen and score lines.
8. Re-color pieces as desired.
9. Make-It
10. Select materials
11. Check placement of materials and adjust if needed
12. Cut Materials
13. Follow prompts for tool changes, if needed.
14. Unload and change mats as needed.

Sunflower Assembly

Assemble pieces with your preferred glue in the order shown below. For felt, I also use a small amount of glue to hold my pieces in place. Then I use embroidery to affix them better and to make them “fancy”.



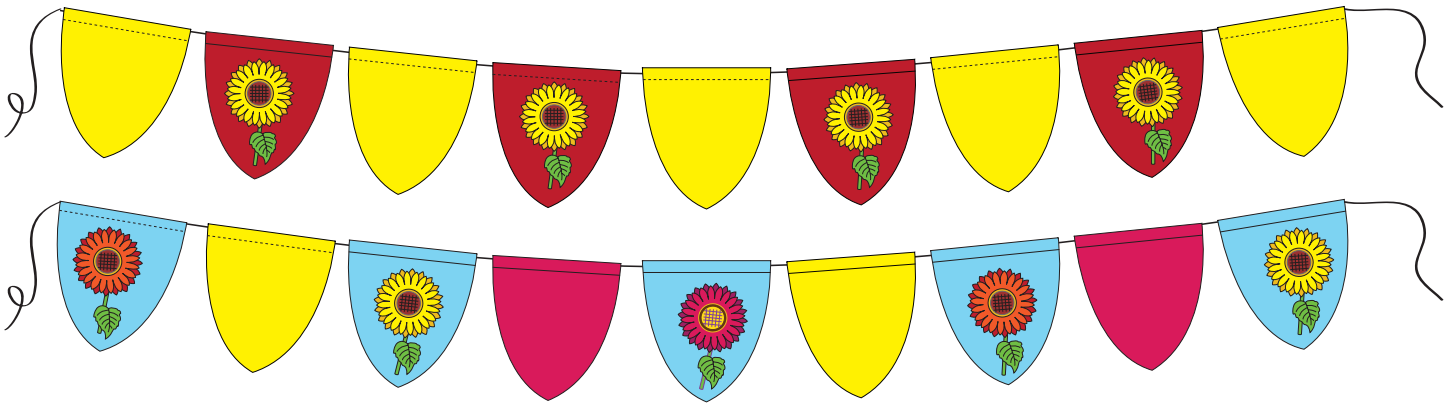
Bunting Assembly

1. Attach / Glue your design to the front of the bunting flag. Some flags may be left blank.
2. Fold top of bunting to the back along the score line. The score line is 1" (2.5cm) from the top edge if you don't have one or it's not visible.
3. Optional: Lay ribbon or string into place before attaching flap, this is especially great for paper bunting.
4. Glue flap into place by running a bead of glue or strip of adhesive along the edge. Press and hold edge for good adhesion.
5. Felt: Sew flap into place for security

Finishing

1. Make as many designs and bunting as needed.
2. Is this for a party? Let guest's decorate extra bunting.
3. String your final design in the desired order. Keep your string long to start with.
4. Determine final length of string/ribbon needed and cut, leaving a bit extra.
5. Finish ends of ribbon to prevent fraying. I used a lighter to melt the ends of most ribbons.
6. Tie a loop at each end of your ribbon to loop around a nail/ hook, or use a push-pin directly through the ribbon into the wall.
